



Verizon Wireless selects Digi to provide wireless backup connectivity at stores

Digi International Inc (Nasdaq:DGII), a provider of device networking, announced on Monday (11 May) that Verizon Wireless, a US mobile network operator and a joint venture between Verizon Communications (NYSE:VZ) and Vodafone (NYSE:VOD) (LSE:VOD), is using Digi Connect WAN 3G high-speed cellular routers to provide wireless broadband backup connectivity at 300 Verizon Wireless Communications Stores in the US. The router is understood to provide backup to a high-speed connection over the Verizon Wireless network when landline service is interrupted. The operator said it is deploying the Digi solution to its stores in the event of a natural disaster or some other local event that breaks landline connections. Digi's cellular routers use Verizon Wireless' EVDO Rev A network to create secure Wireless WAN (WWAN) connections to remote assets for real-time two-way communications. Through its open development program, Verizon Wireless has certified multiple Digi products to run on its network. No financial details were disclosed.
